## **Turkey Fun Facts!**

- According to the U.S. Department of Agriculture, more than 45 million turkeys are cooked and eaten in the U.S. at Thanksgiving that's one sixth of all turkeys sold in the U.S. each year.
- A spooked turkey can run at speeds up to 20 miles per hour. They can also burst into flight approaching speeds between 50-55 mph in a matter of seconds.
- Fossil evidence shows that turkeys roamed the Americas 10 million years ago.
- If you feel groggy after an old-fashioned Thanksgiving meal, the bird on your plate may be partially to blame. Turkey meat contains tryptophan, an amino acid that the body uses to make serotonin, a neurotransmitter in the brain that helps regulate sleep.
- Turkeys are first documented over two thousand years ago in Central America and Mexico.
- 91% of Americans eat turkey on Thanksgiving Day.
- Turkeys were one of the first animals in the Americas to be domesticated.
- Here's one of the most unbelievable Thanksgiving facts: The Guinness Book of Records states that the greatest dressed weight recorded for a turkey is 39.09 kg (86 lbs), at the annual "heaviest turkey" competition held in London, England on December 12, 1989.

### ART SHOW IN THE GARAGE





**Q:** I have noticed that some people allow their dogs to be off leash during their walks. What is the association's position on this practice? **A:** Per the Stoneridge Community Rules #10: "Pet owners are responsible for controlling and picking up after their pets whether within their own unit or while walking/exercising their pets throughout the Stoneridge community". All residents must comply with the Prescott Valley Leash Law 6-01-110: Dogs Not Permitted At Large. For more information on how to report a dog off leash, you may contact Animal Control Supervisor Don Plate at 928-772-5180.



**Q:** Are wood burning fire pits and chimineas permitted in Stoneridge? **A:** Before the addition of any exterior fixture to a residence, a submittal to the Design Review Committee must first be received and reviewed. Because of the close proximity of homes in Stoneridge, any wood burning device would not be approved. However, fire pits plumbed for natural gas or fueled by propane are acceptable.

Q: The weather will be turning colder soon, and we may start to see snow and ice. Am I responsible for the removal of ice and snow from the sidewalk in front of my residence? A: Snow and ice removal is the responsibility of the individual homeowner. Per Town of PV Code 9-04-020; Owner, Lessee or Occupant to Maintain Property; 4.) To keep the portion of any sidewalk immediately adjacent to the property clean and free of snow and ice (including any that accumulates from passing snow plows and other traffic). The Town of Prescott Valley is responsible for plowing roads only, and has published Snow Day Tips at <a href="http://www.pvaz.net/DocumentCenter/View/183">http://www.pvaz.net/DocumentCenter/View/183</a>.

**Q:** I have an anniversary coming up and would like to rent the multi-purpose room at the community center to accommodate my guests. What is the procedure for doing so? **A:** The multi-purpose room is available to residents of Stoneridge on a first-come, first-served basis. There is a reservation packet available at the front counter which must be completed and submitted with a refundable deposit of \$250 before a date can be secured for an event. It is recommended that you plan your event several months in advance to secure your desired date.

**Q:** I have noticed political signs scattered throughout the community. What is the policy on these signs and how long are they allowed to remain up after an election is over? **A:** Per the Town of Prescott Valley: "The Town Code provisions relating to signage of all kinds are continually reviewed in an effort to balance 1st Amendment rights against the broader public interest in aesthetics and public safety. Because of the temporary materials used, political signs are prone to create problems of litter and blight. For this reason, they are classified as temporary signs and are limited to a display period of no more than 60 days prior to the election date and 15 days after the official election date".



- ♦ Bring in any tender houseplants and place them in a sunny spot. Cut back on the fertilizer and remember to water them.
- ♦ Remember to continue watering your plants, even as the temperature decreases; dry plants are more easily damaged by freezing temperatures.
- ♦ Harvest all warm-season vegetables before the first freeze arrives.
- ♦ Continue to plant cool-season transplants such as: broccoli, Brussels sprouts, cabbage, cauliflower, chard, endive, kale, kohlrabi, lettuce, leeks, onion, parsnips, radishes, spinach, and turnips.
- ♦ Continue to plant cool-season transplants such as: broccoli, Brussels sprouts, cabbage, cauliflower, chard, garlic, and lettuce.
- Now is the ideal time to landscape with trees and shrubs; dig and transplant trees and shrubs because their roots will continue to grow even though the rest of the plant is dormant.
- ♦ Replace summer flowers with winter-hardy flowers, such as pansies, snapdragons, or dianthus.
- ♦ Deadhead spent blooms to encourage flowering.
- ♦ Continue to overseed Bermuda lawns to keep the grass green through winter.
- ♦ If you have highly acidic lawns or garden soil, now is the ideal time to fix them. Test your lawn or soil to determine how much agricultural lime is necessary.
- Once leaves begin to fall, be sure to remove them from your lawn; wet leaves can block sunlight and increase the chance of disease.
- ♦ Leave the foliage on your perennials to help insulate them from the harsh winter conditions.
- ♦ Store any remaining garden seeds in airtight containers and keep them in the refrigerator or freezer until the next planting season.
- ♦ Complete fertilization of established roses this month.
- ♦ Prune deciduous trees, but only for structural and safety purposes. Do not prune fruit trees until February or March.





## Thanksgiving Recipe - Glazed Carrots

- ♦ 2 pounds baby carrots
- 2 tablespoons butter, melted
- 1/2 cup firmly packed brown sugar
- 1 1/2 teaspoons McCormick® Cinnamon, Ground
- 1/2 teaspoon McCormick® Ginger, Ground



- Spray inside of 4-quart slow cooker with no stick cooking spray. Add carrots and melted butter; toss to coat. Cover.
- ♦ Cook on HIGH 3 to 4 hours or until tender.
- Meanwhile, mix brown sugar, cinnamon, ginger and salt in small bowl until well blended. Toss cooked carrots with brown sugar mixture in slow cooker just before serving.







## **Caramel Apple Trifles**

#### **Caramel Sauce\***

1/2 cup sugar 3 tbsp. salted butter, cubed, room temperature 1/4 cup heavy cream, room temperature

#### Cinnamon Whipped Cream

1 cups whipping cream 1/2 cup powdered sugar 1 tsp ground cinnamon 1 cup Cinnamon Granola

#### Cinnamon Apples

3 apples, diced 2 tsp. lemon juice 1/8 tsp. nutmeg 2 tsp. cinnamon 6 tbsp. brown sugar 1 tbsp. butter

- 1. To make the caramel, add the sugar in an even layer to the bottom of a medium saucepan.
- 2. Heat sugar on medium-high and whisk until the sugar has melted, about 5 minutes. The sugar will lump together, but eventually melt.
- 3. Continue whisking until the temperature reaches 350 degrees or the sugar has turned an amber color. It will reach 350 degrees very quickly after all the sugar has melted. Watch it very closely. It goes from nice caramel to burned very quickly.
- 4. Remove caramel from heat and add butter. Whisk until melted and combined. Mixture might bubble a bit.
- 5. Add the heavy cream and whisk until incorporated.
- 6. Cool caramel to room temperature.
- 7. To make the apples, combine apples, lemon juice, nutmeg, cinnamon and brown sugar in a medium pan and toss to coat.
- 8. Add butter and cook apples for about 15-20 minutes, or until at preferred softness.
- 9. Allow to cool for 15-20 minutes.
- 10. To make cinnamon whipped cream, freeze a metal bowl and whisk attachment for 10-15 minutes.
- 11. Remove bowl from freezer, add heavy whipping cream, and whip on high speed until it begins to thicken.
- 12. Add powdered sugar and cinnamon and whip until it you get stiff peaks.
- 13. Once everything is made a ready, build the trifles.
- 14. Pipe an even layer of whipped cream into the bottom of the cup or jar you are using.
- 15. Add about 2 tbsp. granola in an even layer.
- 16. Drizzle caramel over granola.
- 17. Spoon apples over caramel.
- 18. Repeat layers 14-17, then drizzle more caramel over the tops of each trifle.
- 19. Store in the fridge for 2-3 hours, or until ready to serve.
- \*You can replace the caramel sauce with a store-bought sauce, if preferred.


